1. Aims, Scope and Principles

This policy applies to all staff at Inclusion Education (Inclusion Hampshire CIO) and its provisions; Inclusion School, Inclusion College and EB8, collectively referred to as 'Inclusion Education'.

We ask that you read this cookie policy carefully as it contains important information on the use of cookies across Inclusion Education websites.

2. What are Cookies?

Cookies are small data files that are placed on your computer or mobile device when you visit a website. Cookies are widely used by online service providers to help build a profile of users. They are also used to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the site. Some of this data will be aggregated or statistical, which means that we will not be able to identify you individually.

You can set your browser not to accept cookies and the information below explains how to remove cookies from your browser. However, some of our website features may not function as a result.

3. Types of Cookies

The cookies we place on your device fall into the following categories:

- Session cookies — these cookies allow our websites to link your actions during a particular browser session. They expire each time you close your browser and do not remain on your device afterwards.
- Persistent cookies — these cookies are stored on your device in between browser sessions. They allow your preferences or actions across our website to be remembered. They will remain on your device until they expire, or until you delete them from your cache.
- Strictly necessary cookies — these cookies are essential for you to be able to navigate our websites and use its features. Without these cookies, the services you have asked for could not be provided.
- Performance cookies — these cookies collect information about how you use our website, e.g., which pages you visit most often. These cookies do not collect personally identifiable information about you. All information collected by these cookies is aggregated and anonymous and is only used to improve how our websites work.
- Functionality cookies — these cookies allow our websites to remember the choices you make (such as your username, language, last action and search preferences) and provide enhanced, more personal features. The information collected by these cookies is anonymous and cannot track your browsing activity on other websites.

4. How We Use Your Cookies

Inclusion Education may request cookies to be set on your computer or device. Cookies are used to let us know when you visit our websites, how you interact with us and to make your experience using the websites better for you. The cookies we collect may differ depending on what you are looking at on our websites. You are able to adapt your cookie preferences but by blocking certain types of cookies, it may mean that your experience our websites is impacted.

5. Consent to Use Cookies

We will ask for your permission (consent) to place cookies or other similar technologies on your device, except where they are essential to provide you with a service that you have requested (e.g., to enable you to put items in your shopping basket and to use our check-out process).

There is a notice on our home page which describes how we use cookies and requests your consent to place cookies on your device.

6. How to Turn Off Cookies

If you do not want to accept cookies, you can change your browser settings so that cookies are not accepted. If you do this, please be aware that you may lose some of the functionality of this website.
